

# Wyloo Bursary Program

## OVERVIEW

Wyloo delivers and invests in the critical minerals and materials needed to decarbonize the world. Our flagship Eagle's Nest Project in the Ring of Fire region is one of the best, undeveloped, high-grade nickel, copper and platinum group element deposits globally, which we aim to build in partnership with First Nation communities.

As we progress with development at Eagle's Nest, we are implementing an all-encompassing sustainability approach based on People, Planet and Project. Our core philosophy, centred on People, emphasizes collaboration and respect for First Nations. By actively engaging with communities, we aim to facilitate an Indigenous co-led review process that ensures the Project design aligns with their values and priorities.

Through engagement and partnership with First Nation communities, we are proud to announce that we have established the Wyloo Bursary Program to encourage members of Marten Falls and Webequie First Nations to continue their education and pursue their various academic goals. Both **Academic Bursary Awards** for degrees, diploma, certificate or upgrading programs at accredited post-secondary institutions and **Trade Bursary Awards** for registered apprentices and students in foundations programs are being awarded.

## ELIGIBILITY

- Member of Webequie First Nation or Marten Falls First Nation.
- Currently enrolled in a post-secondary program, an apprenticeship program, or skill development program through a post-secondary institution or accredited program.
- Must submit a completed application package to [people.canada@wyloo.com](mailto:people.canada@wyloo.com) that includes:
  - Application Form
  - Proof of enrolment in a degree, diploma, certificate or upgrading program at an accredited post-secondary institution or proof of registration in an apprenticeship program or foundations programs.
  - A letter of reference from an employer, school official, or Chief and/or Council member.
  - A cover letter that includes responses to the following questions:
    - Who am I? (Include any personal information you believe is relevant for evaluating your application).
    - What are my future education and career objectives?
    - How does the program I am applying for align with these objectives?
    - How do I intend on giving back to my community?
    - What extracurricular activities have I participated in and how have these activities benefited me and/or my community?

## PROCESS

Bursary applications will be reviewed during the first week of each calendar quarter. Applicants will be notified of Wyloo's decision within 30 days of review. A reminder that incomplete applications will not be considered.
